

## A word from our Associate Principals

### Year 10

It has been an unusual start to Term 2, however, it feels we are almost back to normal. It has been great to see so many of our wonderful Year 10's return to 'face to face' learning. We as a school have continued to show our resilience and to focus on our school work. To ensure our students aren't disadvantaged, we are fortunate enough to offer all the students who missed OLNA in Term 1, due to COVID-19 an opportunity to sit a special OLNA Round 1 catch up window in week 9 of this term. As we progress from the current situation I think it is important to acknowledge just how much our staff and students have developed with the use of ICT. Adjusting to remote learning and then back to 'face to face' learning has really highlighted the use of Connect and how much online information both students and parents can access from home. All staff have completed several professional learning sessions on Webex. This has ensured our students had access to online learning at the start of Term 2 for digital classrooms.

### ICT

We have been fortunate to receive a Bandwidth increase in week 5 to further enable our staff and students to access online learning while at school to further develop student outcomes. We continue to offer iPad training sessions weekly due to our new enrolments.

Just a reminder that we do provide one to one devices, however these need to be treated with respect as they can be quite fragile. Please remind your child to follow the school Network Agreement and Online Policies.

We now have a new Computer Lab set up with 25 high specification desktop computers to help further develop our Digital offerings and capabilities at Champion Bay Senior High School.



As a final note, I just ask for everyone's support to continue to encourage our students to aspire to be their best both in and out of school to help them achieve their desired pathway as they move into senior schooling.

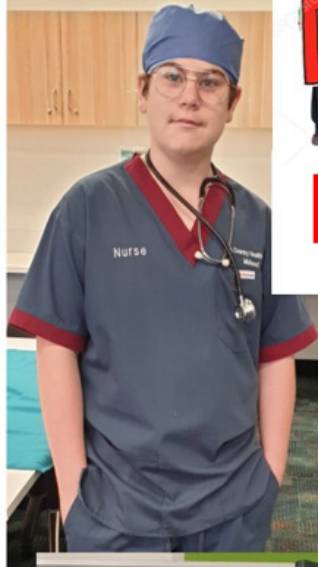

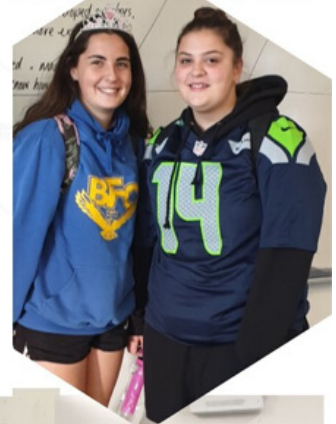
Year 10 Champions at Work sitting on the garden bed they have made with Mr Richards, as part of the Healing Garden rejuvenation project.
