

Kevin Price - Born Storyteller

On Saturday, the 20th of February, twenty Year 11 and 12 students donated their time to attend the Kevin Price Born Storyteller seminar which was kindly arranged by Mrs Alison McCarthy.

Dr Kevin Price is a vibrant presenter and delivered different writing strategies for students; linking the strategies closely to exam techniques. As a teacher of twenty five years, and obviously a former student myself, it was refreshing to be exposed to different ideas for stimulating writing, writing effective dialogue and using figurative language to engage the reader. The best advice for students in their exams was to spend at least half an hour planning before you wrote your response. This was a fresh and timely idea as when I was completing my English exams, we weren't taught to plan beforehand; it was simply pick up that blister inducing pen and write as fast as you could for an entire hour! Examiners reward quality over quantity. Kevin also reminded students that a twist in the tail, or to at least make the examiner smile at the end of a story would achieve a higher mark.

Thank you to Mrs McCarthy for organising the day, and the previous two days for English staff. Thank you to the twenty students who generously gave up their Saturday. Hopefully you enjoyed the day as much as I did and learnt some techniques to improve your writing and ultimately, increase your exam score.
