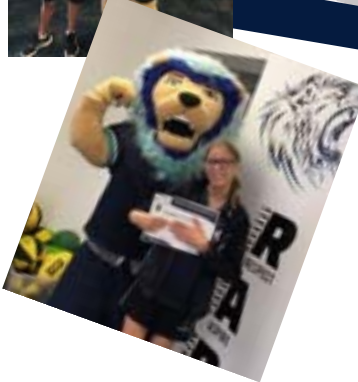
For those that do not know me, I am the

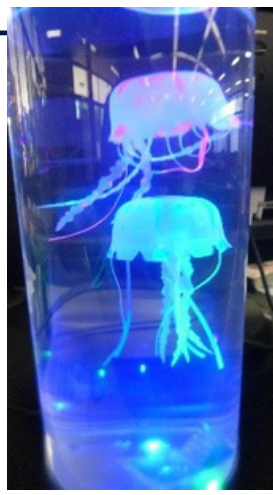


Library Pets

8.2 HASS EXCURSION

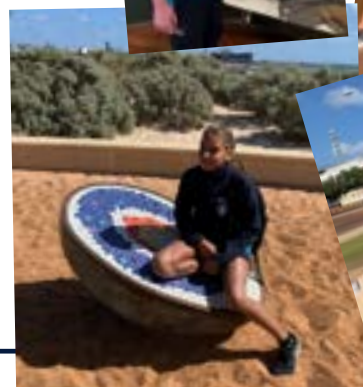
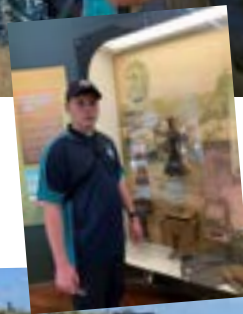
