COVID challenges

This continues to be an interesting time for schools. While we are still experiencing high caseloads among students, we are now seeing the impacts of the virus on the wider school community. Staff are now being impacted in greater numbers, which impacts our daily relief requirements.

My thanks go to the staff of CBSHS who have gone above and beyond to take relief lessons during their DOTT blocks.

During Week 10, I was asked to calculate time spent on COVID processes. I was not surprised to find that it created an extra three to four hours daily. I made a conscious decision to contact the parents of COVID positive students as that information came through to the school. While this was in the nature of 'touching base' with them, we were also able to assist with RATs where required.

During Week 3 of this term, the first load of 'free' student RATs was delivered to the school. This was in the region of 16,000 tests to be distributed to all students. This directive alone, increased the workload of the School Officers – in particular, Kylie Ellerington, who kept track of the deliveries.

While it makes absolute sense for schools to be the delivery point in a scheme such as this, logistically, it was challenging. Many parents collected their allocation over the counter, and we were helped by Clontarf and DSG, who worked with families in the program to get the RATs into the community.

The decision to relieve schools of the task of contact tracing was welcomed by Principals. This task of identifying who a positive student had been with at school was extremely challenging and time consuming, as was contacting all the parents of close contacts. The 'Every day, every classroom' CBSHS mandate still applies to all classrooms – spray hands with sanitiser before entry to a classroom and the wiping of all desks on leaving the room. This means all students and staff enter a clean classroom each block.

Students using public transport are reminded that they must still wear masks while travelling and this message has been sent directly to our parents.

Staff Changes

- Natalie Worthington has been in the role of Associate Principal in Craig Tapper's absence for long service leave. We welcome Craig returning from leave on Monday 30 May. I take this opportunity to thank Natalie for her work during this past five weeks as it has been a great pleasure working with her as an Associate Principal.
- Currently we have two preservice teachers working with staff. We welcome: Sarah den Bore who is working with Ibu Tiana across Indonesian and HPE, and, Rod McGregor is working with Trixie Kerr in Science.
- Welcome back to Chloe Vasic who returns to work after a period of serious illness it is great to see her!
- Jenna McGregor School Officer Student Services has successfully applied for the position of Student Program Coordinator

System Assessments

Week 3 saw the commencement of the annual NAPLAN round of system assessments for Years 7 and 9. While COVID has seen numbers of students tested in the initial round reduced, every effort is made to ensure identified students are tested. This data is invaluable for our planning purposes as the current Year 7 students have not been tested with this broad assessment since they were in Year 3 in 2018. Similarly, due to the impact of COVID in 2020 which saw the assessments postponed, Year 9 students have Year 5 data as their last national system assessment. Externally Set Tasks (ESTs) were also undertaken for Year 12 students in General and Foundation courses. The same impacts apply as for the NAPLAN assessments. 'Catch ups' were underway in Week 4. As can be imagined, the impact of these tests is challenging to timetable for supervision, but COVID adds a new level of complexity. My thanks go to Nat Worthington for her work in this area.

School Assessments

Year 12 students studying ATAR courses had written examinations this week. Some SIDE examinations will be held on Monday 30 May. Further Year 12 assessments are:

- Term 3, Week 10 from Wednesday, 21 September to Friday, 23 September 2022 (SIDE examinations).
- Second Week Term 3 Holidays from Monday, 3 October to Friday, 7 October 2022 (school examinations).

Year 11 students studying ATAR courses will have written examinations:

- Term 2, Week 6 (SIDE examinations)
- Term 2, Week 7 from Tuesday, 7 June to Friday 10 June (school-delivered) Note Monday, 6 June is a public holiday.
- Term 4, Week 5 from Monday, 7 November to Friday, 11 November (both school-delivered and SIDE examinations).

All Year 10 students will sit examinations in Week 8 in: Mathematics, English, HASS, and Science. The results of these examinations will provide useful data in the Year 10 Course Counselling process that is due to commence in Term 3.

Reporting to parents

Student Team Progress Statements were sent to parents/carers in Week 10 of Term 1. These statements are a school-based initiative that allows the community to see how well students have settled into the new school year. They provide information that will allow parents to make decisions about when and if to contact staff about student performance. Usually, these statements are followed up by Parent Teacher meeting opportunities early in Term 2, however schools have been constrained by a number of factors including COVID meeting restrictions.

The Semester One formal reports will look slightly different to those previously sent home. For this set of reports, schools have been supported to make adjustments to reports in recognition of the pressure that schools and staff have been under this semester. These reports will contain no Form comments. Please contact the school on 9965 8300 to speak with your student's Team Leader.

A Year 12 Parent Teacher evening will be held on Tuesday 21 June from 5:00-7:00pm. Year 12 reports will be available from this event. Bookings for this will open in Week 6.
