2023 Year 12 Results

I am pleased to announce the following key results from our year 12 2023 cohort. My congratulations to the students their diligence and ambition as they completed their final year of schooling.

Key among the improvements were:

- The WACE achievement rate of 76% is higher than like schools. The WACE achievement rate has increased by 14% in one year. The number of WACE eligible students has more than doubled in one year, yet there has been this notable increase in attainment.
- The percentage of students meeting the breadth and depth requirement has remained high at 97%; this consistency is notable as there was a significant increase in the number of students meeting the requirement (from 56 to 98 in one year).
- The C grade requirement was met by 94% of students, which is a historical high for CBSHS (up from
- Median ATAR has increased from 50.65 in 2022 to 86.25 in 2023, an increase of 35.6 points. Like schools had a median ATAR of 59.5 and WA Public Schools had a median ATAR of 82.8. Therefore, Champion Bay SHS outperformed like and public schools using 2023 median ATAR as a measure.
- Champion Bay SHS performed 2.73 standard deviations above expected for median ATAR in 2023

The current Year 10 students were in Year 7 when the last carnival was held. Once again, we had a terrific student turnout and a great day was had by all. The winning team was Sunset, but participation points and individual champions came from all of the Houses. My thanks to Ronan Croft and the HPE team for their organisation and to staff for their help on the day. Special thanks to Sue Macdonald and her team of caterers who kept the staff well fed. The day was a true team event.

NAPLAN

Today I closed the NAPLAN site for 2024 as the testing window finished across Australia. We managed a good coverage of students in Years 7 and 9 across the four assessments. Given that the first assessment was Writing held on Wednesday 13 March (that test could be held on Wednesday/Thursday of that week only), and the three remaining assessments held over seven days - including catch up sessions for students who had missed a test due to absence, we only had a handful of Year 7 students who missed tests and could not be caught up due to time constraints. There were more year 9 students who could not be assessed due to absence, but the catch up sessions did capture several. This year we concentrated on using the same staff to supervise test sessions with assistance from other teachers. This was a big impost on the supervising teachers' time, but the consistency of test delivery was high. Thanks especially to Neil Wyatt, Helen Lydon, Craig Tapper, Michael Coughlan, Rebecca Bright, Maddy Hughes, Erin Dawson, Nick Mozley, Tammy Solomon, Ronan Croft, Nicole Maher, Marnie Bell and Jo Corlett for supervising over the test period, and to the large number of staff who assisted - some during their DOTT time.

Board of CBSHS

Our Board has been formed, and we are just awaiting screening information before announcing the new membership. Due to our short term and my lack of availability in the last weeks of this term, we meet in term 3 of next term.

How to register your child & provide consent

Parents/guardians can register their dependants and provide consent via a secure online consent form, which will automatically record their details in WA Health's Vaccine Management System (VaccinateWA). For assistance in using VaccinateWA, please email SBIP@health.wa.gov.au or call 9222 2486.

If you're not able to access the online system, you can print a copy of the school-based immunisation program consent form, or your school office will have paper copies.

Note: Details from the paper form will be entered into the VaccinateWA system so you may receive emails from VaccinateWA.

Instructions for consenting online

- 1. Access the online consent form or scan the QR code
- 2. Enter your child/dependant's details.
- 3. Enter your child/dependant's school information.
- 4. Enter your own details, as the parent/guardian of that child/dependant.
- 5. Provide consent for the relevant vaccination plan selected.
- 6. Acknowledge and sign the form.
- 7. Submit the form. An email will be sent from VaccinateWA confirming your consent.

If you need to update any details, please submit the form again.

All students require parent/guardian consent before they can receive any vaccinations at the school.








MATHEMATICS
